INFORMATION FOR ADULT PATIENTS

- 1 The telephone number of the hospital is Kendal 1441.
- 2 Please bring :—

- 3 Patients are advised not to bring cash, valuables, etc., when entering hospital, but if this is essential, these items should be handed to Matron for safe custody.
- 4 It is strictly forbidden to offer or promise any money or other present to the Sisters, Nurses or any Officer of the Hospital.
- 5 Patients may be visited as follows :— **Adult Wards:** Sunday, 2-0 to 3-0 p.m; Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday, 6-30 to 7-0 p.m; Thursday and Saturday, 2-0 to 3-0 p.m.
Children's Ward : Daily, except Monday and Wednesday, 2-30 to 3-0 p.m.
- 6 Patients may not be visited at other times except by arrangement with the Matron.
- 7 Persons who have been directly or indirectly in contact with cases of infectious disease are earnestly requested to refrain from visiting the Hospital.
- 8 In the interest of the patient, visitors are restricted to four on each visiting day and not more than two at one time.
- 9 Patients may smoke at certain times at the discretion of the Ward Sister.
- 10 No provisions or liquors of any description except eggs, fruit, jam and biscuits may be brought into the Hospital, and these should be handed to the Sister.
- 11 Everything possible is done for the welfare of patients whilst in Hospital, but patients having any cause for complaint should see the Administrative Officer before leaving.
